Work opportunities

A student visa requires a minimum of 20 hours attending full time study in the school per week.

This allows students to gain a part time or casual job (no more than 20 hours per week) in the local hairdressing industry or in the many restaurants, cafes, and throughout the hospitality industry.

Health & Medical Insurance

Australia has a special system of health cover for international students called Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). It is the responsibility of every international student to ensure that they have **valid Overseas Student Health Care cover at all times**. You must have health cover for the duration of your enrolment as a condition of your visa requirements. The health cover will help you pay for any medical or hospital care you may need while you're studying in Australia, and will contribute towards the cost of prescription medicines and an ambulance in an emergency. Dental, optical and physiotherapy are not covered.

Students studying on Visitor, Working Holiday or Tourist Visas must have a health check if they continue studying for more than four weeks and must have private travel and health insurance.

Course Content and Modes of Study and Assessment

AIH provides the following courses over a period of between 21 – 28 hours per week (depending on the course), with a combination of classroom and simulated workplace training approaches.

Assessments include written tests, assignments and observation of tasks in a simulated workplace. Students will be assessed according to established industry standards.

Students who successfully complete their course will be awarded with a qualification that is recognised nationally.

Qualification Pathways

Applicants may enroll in Certificate III in Hairdressing as a standalone qualification.

Applicants wishing to enroll in Certificate IV must provide proof of the Australian qualification of Certificate III in Hairdressing.

Applicants may enroll in Diploma of Hairdressing Salon Management as a standalone qualification.

Course Money Refund Policy

Academy of International Hairdressing will provide a total refund of tuition fees paid in advance where a course place is no longer available or a Visa has been denied, less the application fee. Additionally AIH will provide a total refund of fees paid in advance or for tuition already received, less the application fee where:

- a) The course does not start on the agreed starting day.
- b) The course ceases to be provided at any time after it starts but before it is completed; or
- c) The course is not provided in full to the student because a sanction has been imposed on the registered provider under part 6 (ESOS Act)

Where a written application is received for a Course Money Refund AIH staff will:

- Provide a total refund of course money paid in advance where a Visa has been denied.
- Provide a full refund of course money paid in advance, where enrolling students provide more than 10 weeks written notice of their intention to withdraw from the course prior to the course commencement. The refund will be less the maximum of 10% or \$1000, whichever is the lesser, for administrative expenses.
- Provide a partial refund of course money paid in advance, where enrolling students provide more than 4 weeks and up to 10 weeks written notice of their intention to withdraw from the course prior to the course commencement. The refund will be 70% of term's fees less the maximum of 10% or \$1000, whichever is the lesser, for administrative expenses.
- Provide a partial refund of course money paid in advance, where enrolling students provide less than 4 weeks written notice of their intention to withdraw from the course prior to the course commencement. The refund will be 40% of term's fees, less the maximum of 10% or \$1000, whichever is the lesser, for administrative expenses.
- Provide a partial refund to students who withdraw after the commencement of the course up till the first 4 weeks. The refund shall be 30 % of term's fees, less the maximum of 10% or \$1000, whichever is the lesser, for administrative expenses.
- Apply no refund where a student has withdrawn from the course after the 4th week of the course.

Course Money Refund Policy Continued

- A student, who has paid for more than two terms in advance and withdraws during term and more than four weeks before the commencement of the following term, will receive no refund of fees for the current term and at least 70% of the following term's fees and a full refund of fees paid for any subsequent term.
- Should AIH Management withdraw its offer or fails to provide the program offered or terminates its course delivery before or after term/Education Service commences AIH will provide a full refund of course money.
- Should AIH Management withdraw a student from a Course because the student has seriously breached international student visa conditions or a provider's rules, no refund of the current term's fees and 40% of fees applicable to a subsequent term and a full refund of fees paid for any subsequent term.

Refund Procedures

Where a student believes that they have grounds for a course fee refund, students should:

- Submit a written request for course fee refund to the Overseas Contact Officer.
- State valid reasons for their course refund application.
- Allow 7 days for the application to be processed by AIH Management
- Recognise that AIH's Management refund policy and the availability of complaints and appeals processes, does not remove the right of the student to take action under Australia's consumer protection laws.
- When receiving a written course fee refund application the Overseas Contact Officer shall:
 - Present the application to AIH management
 - Provide the student in writing the resulting decision of AIH Management.
 - Advise the student of their right to appeal the decision of AIH Management.

This agreement, and the availability of complaints and appeals processes, does not remove the right of the student to take action under Australia's consumer protection laws.



AIH Management and staff are committed to ensuring that all enrolling students are provided with necessary, timely and accurate information that relates to its training and assessment services available to overseas students.

To be accepted as an International student at the Academy of International Hairdressing you require the following;

- A Student Visa to study an Australian Hairdressing qualification.
- Demonstrate a minimum English proficiency IELTS 5.5 **or** approved ELICOS course (English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students) if IELTS (International English Language Test Result) is under 5.5. We recommend WA English College:
- www.westaustrianenglish.wa.edu.au
- *Overseas Student Health Cover* is compulsory for all students in Australia on a student visa, and the *Department of Immigration & Citizenship* (DIAC) requires that students maintain the health cover for the duration of the student visa.
- A valid passport, during and 6 months after the course completion date.
- Study full time (20 hours per week)
- Maintain a minimum of 80% attendance

- The enrolling staff member shall provide (by mail or by hand) the applicant with a letter of offer and acceptance for the relevant course being applied for.
- On receiving a completed Letter of Offer and Acceptance the enrolling staff member shall ensure that enrolling student has signed AIH's letter of offer and acceptance and that they have acknowledged their receipt of the 'ESOS Framework' by ticking the relevant box on the letter of offer and acceptance.
- Make sure you have read and signed the Terms & Conditions and Cancellation & Refund Policy in the enrolment application.
- The enrolling staff member shall ensure that they only receive course money from a student or Education agent after or at the same time the signed letter of offer and acceptance has been received.
- Once the application and letter of offer and acceptance has been received the enrolling staff shall initiate an electronic confirmation of enrolment (ECOE) through the PRISMS system and return the AIH signed Letter of Offer and Acceptance and relevant ECOE to the student. The Confirmation of Enrolment will enable you to apply for a Student Visa.
- The enrolling staff member shall report to AIH Management advice of any student who fails commence his or her course within 10 days of their non commencement.
- AIH Management shall report any student for non commencement of courses via the PRISMS System within the ESOS Act (Section 19.1c) requirement of 14 days.

- A copy of your passport, please attach current visa if you are in Australia

Applying for a student Visa

A student visa is required to study an Australian Hairdressing Qualification at the Academy of International Hairdressing.

Each student visa is assessed according to an assessment level. The assessment level is determined by the passport held and the visa applied for. Assessment level 1 represents the lowest assessment level and assessment level 5 the highest. The higher the assessment level, the more evidence you must provide to your visa office to demonstrate your financial capacity, your understanding of the English language and other relevant matters. The Academy of International Hairdressing requires a minimum of 5.5 IELTS or equivalent.
